Dan 9:24-27, NASB adapted

Seventy weeks have been decreed for your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to make an end of sin, to make atonement for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophet and to anoint a most holy thing. 25 So you are to know and discern that from the issuing of a decree to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until Messiah a Prince there will be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks. It will be built again, with plaza and moat, but in times of distress. ²⁶ Then after the sixty-two weeks the Messiah will be cut off but not for himself, and the people of the prince who is to come will destroy the city and the sanctuary. And its end will come with a flood; even to the end there will be war; desolations are determined. ²⁷ And he will make a firm covenant with the many with respect to one week, but in the middle of the week he will put a stop to sacrifice and grain offering; and on the wing of abominations will come one who makes desolate, even until a complete destruction, one that is decreed, is poured out on the one who makes desolate.

ESV adapted

Seventy weeks are decreed about your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to put an end to sin, and to atone for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal both vision and prophet, and to anoint a most holy place. ²⁵ Know therefore and understand that from the going out of the word to restore and build Jerusalem to the coming of an anointed one, a prince, there shall be seven weeks. Then for sixty-two weeks it shall be built again with squares and moat, but in a troubled time. ²⁶ And after the sixty-two weeks, an anointed one shall be cut off and shall have nothing. And the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. Its end shall come with a flood, and to the end there shall be war. Desolations are decreed. ²⁷ And he shall make a strong covenant with many for one week, and for half of the week he shall put an end to sacrifice and offering. And on the wing of abominations shall come one who makes desolate, until the decreed end is poured out on the desolator.



Daniel and Jesus

- ◆ Jesus is the ultimate image of God (ch. 2).
- ◆ Jesus is the stone cut from heaven that comes to earth and grows into a mighty mountain (ch. 2).
- ◆ Jesus is the true image that people must worship (ch. 3; 7:14).
- lack Jesus is the true tree of life (4:11–12).
- **♦** Jesus is the humble king who seeks his Father's glory and not his own (4:17).
- ◆ Jesus is the one like a son of man who reigns over all the peoples of the earth from God's right hand (7:13–14).
- **♦** Jesus is the day of atonement sacrifice who rises into heaven on a cloud in conjunction with God's destroying the fourth beast (7:13; 9:24).
- ◆ Jesus is the one who shares his kingdom with the saints (7:18), who themselves will rise to everlasting life (12:2).

Summary

The Most High God is in control of all history and powers and will eventually triumph over every proud kingdom through his Messiah's saving death and everlasting dominion, which God will prove by raising his humble saints from death to life.
